Protecting Children from Criminal Exploitation, Human Trafficking & Modern Slavery: An addendum

The programme of joint targeted area inspections (JTAs) began in January 2016 and brings together four inspectorates – Ofsted, Care Quality Commission (CQC), HMI Constabulary and Fire & Rescue Services (HMICFRS) and HMI Probation (HMIP). The latest report is the findings from three joint targeted area inspections, carried out in the spring of 2018, that examined the response to child exploitation and children missing from home, care or education.
