Updates

The critical response to the delayed and much-criticised report from Public Health England on the impact of COVID-19 continues to grow.

With the Government facing criticism after publication of the report was apparently delayed, and the report finding that people from a BAME background are at greater risk from the virus yet no recommendations being made on how we can keep people safe, the Equalities and Human Rights Commission has launched an inquiry.

The Fawcett Society has produced research into the impact of the coronavirus lockdown on women from a BAME background.

Some findings: 43% of disabled or retired BAME women say that they had lost government support compared with 13% of white women in the same group. Over half (51%) of disabled or retired BAME women also said they were not sure where to turn to for help compared with 1 in 5 (19%) of white women.


People's Commission

The All Parliamentary Group on Social Integration has published its interim report from the COVID-19 inquiry.

The findings focus around:

- the impact of COVID-19 on social isolation
- community relations
- the different responses to the crisis
- volunteering

They also have some recommendations which include this one - "during the crisis period all councils should have a cabinet lead whose remit covers social isolation and volunteering."
